**Find and write the information on how the rings of Olympic Games convey the message of diversity? (black, blue, red, yellow and green rings)**

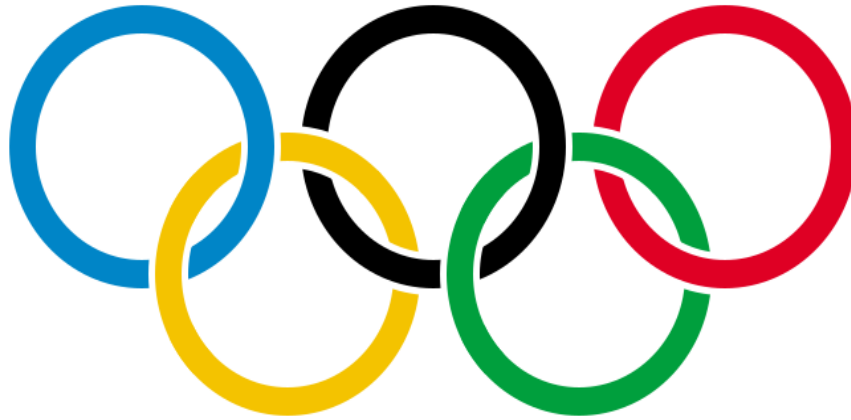
### **Social Science- Answer**

The Olympic symbol consists of five interlaced rings of equal dimensions (the Olympic rings), used in five different colours. When used in its five-colour version, these colours shall be, from left to right, blue, yellow, black, green and red. The rings are interlaced from left to right; the blue, black and red rings are situated at the top, the yellow and green rings at the bottom. The five interlocking rings represent the five continents that were present at the 1912 Games. These were: Africa, the Americas, Oceania, Asia, and Europe. No one lives in Antarctica so it doesn't get it's own ring. The Olympic symbol expresses the activity of the Olympic

Movement and represents the union of the five continents and the meeting of athletes from throughout the world at the Olympic Games.
