1. She was the daughter of the wealthy and aristocratic nationalist leader MotiLal Nehru and sister of the first prime minister of independent India, Jawaharlal Nehru. Her famous words were: 'The more we sweat in peace, the less we bleed in war.'
2. He was an American printer, publisher, author, inventor, scientist, and diplomat. He made important contributions to science and is remembered for his wisdom and writing style. His famous words were: 'Well done is better than well said.'
3. Best known as a poet of nature, he served as Great Britain's poet laureate from 1843 until his death. His Lyrical Ballads, published in 1798, written with Samuel Taylor Coleridge, helped launch the 'Romantic' movement in English literature. His famous words were: 'The child is the father of man.'
4. A poet, novelist, playwright, painter, and musician—he won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1913 for his collection of poetry Gitanjali. His famous words were: 'You can't cross the sea merely by standing and staring at the water.'

5. His theories of relativity led to new research regarding the theories of time, space, matter, energy, and gravity. His famous words were: 'Imagination is more important than knowledge. Knowledge is limited. Imagination encircles the world.'
6. The 16th president of the United States, he ranks among the greatest of all American statesmen. During the Civil War, he maintained the unity of the country, and he also played an important role in bringing freedom to the African American slaves. His famous words were: 'you can fool all the people some of the time, and some of the people all the time, but you cannot fool all the people all the time.'
7. One of the most famous Jewish victims of Nazi persecution, this 15-year-old diarist penned one of the world's most powerful accounts of Jewish life during World War II. Her famous words were: 'we all live with the objective of being happy; our lives are all different and yet the same.'
8. He led the civil rights movement in the United States and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964. His famous words were: 'I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the colour of their skin but by the content of their character.'
9. An American educator and author, she became the first deaf-blind person to graduate from college. Her famous words were: 'The best and most beautiful things in the world cannot be seen or even touched—they must be felt with the heart.'
10. An Irish dramatist and literary critic, he won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1925. His famous words were: 'Success does not consist in never making mistakes but in never making the same one a second time.'
